

Online courses: practical elements

In this way, everyone will have the opportunity to organize themselves according to their own schedule.

4. Offer different formats

An online course can have the characteristic of losing some of the experience that takes place in traditional training courses, especially in the face-to-face relationship with the tutor and other students. Nevertheless, it allows to constantly offer new formats to transmit knowledge: from infographics to videos, from animations to audio, a virtual path can "awaken" all the students' senses to capture their attention.
