Current and future most in-demand professions

In the Italian job market, the most in-demand professions reflect technological evolution and emerging needs in productive sectors. According to the "**Forecasts of occupational and professional needs in Italy in the medium term (2024-2028)**" report by Unioncamere's Excelsior Information System, significant demand is predicted in various areas.

Current and future most in-demand professions in Italy range from the technological to the healthcare sector, including sustainability and consulting. Acquiring specific skills in these sectors is an effective strategy for facing contemporary job market challenges.

Technology and digital sector

Digitalization pervades every sector, increasing the demand for IT professionals. Roles such as **software developers, data analysts, and cybersecurity** specialists are highly sought after. In particular, artificial intelligence engineers and SOC (Security Operations Center) analysts are among the most in-demand emerging figures.

Green sector and sustainability

The ecological transition stimulates demand for professionals with green skills. **Sustainability specialists, energy managers, and environmental consultants** are essential for companies aiming to reduce environmental impact and comply with current regulations. The Excelsior report predicts that approximately 2.4 million workers will need to possess green skills by 2028.

Healthcare and personal care sector

Population aging and recent health emergencies have increased the demand for healthcare professionals. **Doctors, nurses, healthcare workers, and telemedicine specialists** are among the most sought-after figures. The Excelsior report indicates a need for between 431,000 and 456,000 units in the health sector by 2028.

Financial and consulting sector

The growing market complexity requires experts in finance and business consulting. Figures such as **financial analysts, tax consultants, and risk managers** are fundamental for guiding companies in strategic decisions. The financial sector forecasts a need for between 378,000 and 454,000 units in the coming years.

Educational and training sector

Continuous education is crucial in a rapidly evolving world. **Teachers, trainers, and eLearning specialists** are increasingly in demand to meet professional development needs. The Excelsior report estimates a need for between 445,000 and 465,000 units in the training and culture sector.

Commerce and tourism sector

Despite recent challenges, commerce and tourism remain vital sectors. **Sales staff, digital marketing experts, and hospitality professionals** are among the most sought-after figures. Demand for between 620,000 and 713,000 units is predicted in this sector.

Key skills for in-demand professions

The professional figures mentioned above require targeted and quality training that allows for enhancing already acquired skills or developing new ones.

The Unioncamere report presents a **list of skills** that are expected to become increasingly central in the immediate future.

Advanced digital skills

Mastery of digital tools, programming languages, and emerging technologies is essential. Knowledge of **artificial intelligence** and **machine learning** allows for developing innovative solutions, improving processes and products.

Green skills and environmental sustainability

Growing attention to sustainability requires professionals capable of implementing eco-compatible practices. Skills in **environmental management, renewable energy, and circular economy** are increasingly valued.

Relational skills and soft skills

Abilities such as **effective communication, leadership, problem solving, and teamwork** are fundamental. These **transversal skills** facilitate collaboration and conflict management, improving the work environment and productivity.

Language and intercultural skills

In a globalized market, knowledge of **foreign languages and the ability to operate in multicultural contexts** are competitive advantages. These skills facilitate international expansion and improve relationships with foreign clients and partners.

Analytical and data analysis skills

The ability to interpret complex data and draw strategic conclusions is increasingly in demand. Skills in **data analysis, statistics, and use of analytical software** allow for making informed and evidence-based decisions.

Acquiring skills: eLearning, in-person, or mixed

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Recognized certifications: public vs private

Recognition of online certifications varies by context: in the public education system, regulated by the Ministry of Education and Merit (MIM), and in the private sector, where companies independently evaluate candidates' qualifications.

- **Recognition in the public education system:** certifications must be issued by MIM-accredited or recognized entities.
- **Recognition in the private sector:** companies recognize and appreciate online certifications, especially if issued by entities or platforms with a solid reputation.

To ensure recognition of online certifications in both public and private sectors, it is therefore fundamental to:

- ensure that the issuing entity is MIM-accredited or recognized.
 - verify that the certification meets the standards required for the sector of interest.
 - clearly present the acquired skills and their relevance to the desired position.
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Open badges to enhance acquired skills

Once skills are acquired, they need to be enhanced. **Open Badges** are digital badges that certify skills, abilities, or achieved results. Based on an international standard, they incorporate detailed metadata describing the acquired competency, the issuing entity, and evidence of achievement.

Advantages of open badges

- **Portability:** being digital, they can be easily shared across different online platforms.
- **Verifiability:** incorporated metadata allows employers to verify authenticity.
- **Flexibility:** they can certify various skills, from soft skills to technical competencies.

Enhancing skills on professional social networks and CVs

- **Curriculum Vitae:** include a dedicated section for certifications, with links to the digital badge.
- **Professional social networks:** platforms like LinkedIn allow adding certifications to profiles, increasing visibility and demonstrating commitment to self-training.
- **Online portfolio:** create a digital portfolio that collects all obtained Open Badges, with descriptions of acquired skills and practical applications.
